

National-level Implementation of the Belém GAP

Seventeen (17) activities and 38 deliverables of the Belém gender action plan have a level of implementation at the national level. The vast majority of these deliverables are led by Parties, among other actors.

Priority Area A: capacity-building, knowledge management and communication

Fourteen (14) Priority Area A deliverables across five (5) activities have national-level implementation.

A.1 Strengthen institutional and individual capacity within Governments for planning, implementing, monitoring, reporting on and evaluating gender-responsive national climate change policies, plans, strategies and actions, as appropriate, as reported by Parties in regular reports and communications under the UNFCCC and in national and sectoral plans
